

By Road from the South, East or North

Wareside is best approached in an easterly direction from the town of Ware which sits adjacent to the A10 London-Cambridge road.

From the South:

Turn off the A10 at the A414 junction signposted towards Harlow and take the second exit at the roundabout at the foot of the exit slip-road. Keep in the left lane and take the second exit at the next roundabout (about 200 yards), signposted to Ware. Follow this road for just over a mile and take the second exit (fork right) at the mini-roundabout, then (after about 100 yards) take the first exit at the next to proceed towards the town centre. As the road bends to the right and crosses the river, keep in the right-hand lane to turn right (second exit) at the next roundabout. Go to "From Ware" below.

From the East:

Follow the A414 from Hertford, turning right (3rd exit at the large roundabout) onto the southbound A10. Continue on the A10 till the next junction and turn off towards Harlow (A414). At the bottom of the slip-road, take the first exit, then proceed from "Keep in the left lane" in the paragraph above.

From the North:

Turn off the A10 at the first Ware exit signposted Ware A1170, Wadesmill and Thundridge (a short exit lane and a tight bend). At the roundabout, turn right towards Ware and follow this road to the next roundabout. At this, go straight on by taking the second exit (the first exit is to a car park) and proceed carefully down the High Street to the next roundabout at the bottom of the road. Take the first exit at this roundabout. Follow directions from "From Ware" below.

From Ware:

Follow the road for about 2 miles through the countryside to Wareside. (There is a petrol station on the right after about 600 yards.)

Once in Wareside (signalled by the 30mph speed limit signs and a sharp lefthand bend), turn left at the fork down a single-track road signposted to the Parish Church and JMI School. The church is on the right, approximately half a mile from the junction. There is space for about 6 cars to park in a lay-by directly outside the church. Parking for funerals and weddings is arranged with a local farming family – follow the signs past the church and round the bend (about 500 yards). Please do not double park on the road – it is a bus route!

By Road from the North and East

Wareside is to the south and west of Bishop's Stortford. Most of the journey is on country lanes, but there are not many junctions so it is a fairly straightforward journey.

First, follow the signs to Much Hadham (travel on the B1004). When the road comes to an end at a T-junction, turn left and proceed south on the main road through Much Hadham (still the B1004) and into Widford. The entrance to Widford village is marked by 30mph speed limit signs and an incline where the road narrows. When the road widens again, it bears to the right and heads out past Widford School (through a pair of traffic-calming devices which narrow the road) and, further along, Widford Church until it comes into Wareside Village at the end of a long straight section with a gentle hump-backed bridge.

The road bends round to the right in the 30mph limit, but 20mph is fast enough because the road narrows and also because 20 yards after the Chequers pub (on the right) you must turn sharp right up a single-track road.

At the top of this short road, turn right at the T-junction. **Holy Trinity** church building is on the right after about 400 yards. There is space for about 6 cars to park in a lay-by directly outside the church. Parking for funerals and weddings is arranged with a local farming family – follow the signs past the church and round the bend (about 500 yards). Please do not double park on the road – it is a bus route!

The Rectory is in Hunsdon

From the South:

Hunsdon is clearly signposted from the A414 between the towns of Harlow and Hertford. From the junction, head north along "Church Lane". (Your Sat-Nav might think the road is called Eastwick Road, but this was actually changed to Church Lane in 2007.)

The Rectory is approximately 0.9 miles further along the same road, which becomes Acorn Street (SG12 8PB). After the first housing settlement (including cream, grey and pink cottages and a *dangerous narrow bit!*), the road appears to continue into open countryside again. Then the speed restriction changes to 30mph as you reach the "Hunsdon" village sign. The Rectory is 150m further on the left-hand side. The driveway is slightly concealed but is opposite Wicklands Road (which is obvious on the right-hand side of the road). The Rectory is the modern house up the right-hand fork of the drive, <u>not</u> the giant Old Rectory to the left.

From the North and East:

Follow the directions to Widford (above), but where the B1004 widens after the incline and bears to the right, the road to Hunsdon (the B180) goes straight ahead (through a traffic-calming measure which narrows the road, giving priority to oncoming vehicles).

Follow the B180 south out of Widford as it winds into Hunsdon (not far) and continue on this road through the village past the school (left), garage (right) and village pump (left) before turning left into Acorn Street immediately after the Crown public house.

The Rectory is on the right approximately 150 yards from the junction. It is the modern house up the right-hand fork of the drive, <u>not</u> the giant Old Rectory to the left (SG12 8PB).
